ARISE, at a Glance

For Principals, College Heads and Placement Officers

ARISE — the Association to Rebuild India through Service and Entrepreneurship — is a youth movement that builds the nation by building the person: *Vyaktinirmaan se Rashtranirmaan*, national development through individual development.

In clubs hosted by colleges, members grow across the **five dimensions** of their being — physical, intellectual, emotional, social, and the inner life of meaning and purpose — through a simple engine: **learn, serve, earn**. They study what builds a nation, serve those most in need around them, and learn to mobilise resources with absolute integrity. The movement is apolitical and non-sectarian, and open to every young Indian.

What an ARISE club is

- A chartered body of **twenty or more students** under a written constitution, meeting weekly on campus.
- Guided by **two named advisers** — one from your own faculty, one from ARISE — with a sponsoring mentor.
- Every member enters through one door, the **Entry Gate**: a readiness questionnaire on the five dimensions, a sixty-second self-introduction, the mission presented to two persons of standing, and their two testimonials — validated by both advisers.
- Leadership is **formed, not given**: first-years enter the leadership pipeline as board-elects, serve on the board in second year, advise in third, and train in the fourth and beyond. Students of **every year** join as members — the whole field of learning, service, club life and honours is open to all.

The commitment asked of students

ARISE charges its members **no fee**; it asks commitment instead: at least **thirty minutes of learning a day** and **two hours of service a week**, reckoned monthly from a validated record. Sustained shortfall ends the membership automatically. Seriousness is the price of belonging.

The year

New clubs are chartered together at the **Charter Convocation** in October; the formation window runs to the **New Leaders Convention** in April; the first club boards are installed on **1 July**.

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
